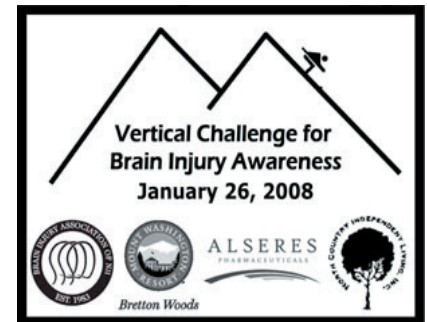
AWA Launches New Web Site

Pricing News from the President

During the month of January, many manufacturers review their pricing for the upcoming year. To keep a competitive edge, many try hard to hold their prices steady from year to year.
